LOSS AND BEREAVEMENT

Two members of the parish give their impressions of a recent course organised by Pontefract Deanery:



Death is one of the facts of life that many of us find very difficult to cope with and when it was announced that a bereavement course was to be held, a group of us from St Cuthbert's and All Saints' decided to attend.

We attended the course for one session each week for five weeks. The first week dealt with loss as a normal part of life - looking at our own losses and how to cope with them and understanding the bereavement process. Week two concentrated on helping the bereaved - the ceremonies and rituals and when grief goes wrong. Another week stressed the importance of developing listening skills and the penultimate week, thinking about our own death and what we believe as Christians and then finally guidance on using what we have learned.

The course enabled us to confront and organise our feelings on this difficult subject and will help us to provide comfort to others in these situations.



Archdeacon David writes ...

Radically Open To God


In the Bible we find that people, often at the most unexpected times, become radically open to God. Moses having fled for his

life from the royal court of Egypt, spent years in exile most of them as a shepherd. Then, one day, he came face to face with God at the burning bush. Why that day, why that time? Young David (later to become King) had a similar experience. His

father (Jesse) apparently had little love for him, so he spent years looking after the sheep, but used the time to develop his courage, to perfect some skills with a sling, and become more aware of God's presence with him. Then one day, he is suddenly summoned to join the family because Samuel has

arrived — and finds himself anointed King. Out of the blue as it were.

Perhaps you who are reading



the Church sets aside a time — Lent, as a period when we can particularly make ourselves ready to be "radically open to God".

Now, whenever we yearn to make a fresh and deepening relationship with God, the first thing we must do is to



recognise that that desire is of God Himself. He put it there in you and me. God's longing for us is the spring of ours for Him. We are reminded of this in the story of the lost son and the loving father — most people call it the Parable of the Prodigal Son. The son, at the end of his tether and desperate, starts for home; but the Father sees him coming and rushes to meet him with love and delight.

That is how God responds to

you and to me when we turn to Him to renew our relationship with Him, and deepen it.

So, let us use this Lent to discover again that immense longing in the heart of God to enable us to know ourselves better, and for us to know Him better. George Appleton, (one time Archbishop in Jerusalem), and a compiler of many great prayers, wrote this which I commend to you for use in Lent:

Lord, I offer what I am to what you are.

I stretch up to You in desire – my attention on You alone. I cannot grasp You, explain You, describe You – Only cast myself into the depths of Your mystery, Only let your love pierce the cloud of my unknowing. Let me forget all but You – You are what I long for You are my chiefest good, You are my eager hope You are my allness.

In the glimpses of Your Eternity, Your unconditional freedom, Your unfailing wisdom, Your perfect love -

I am humble and worshipping, warming to love and hope Wanting and available for your will dear Lord. Amen.

PCC NOTES, FEBRUARY

- 1 The treasurer reported on the church accounts for the year ended 31 December 1992. The accounts were approved.
- 2 Guidelines for parking at St Cuthbert's Church will shortly be made available.
- 3 It was agreed to plan to hold a stewardship mission in the spring of 1994.
- 4 A report was given on recent building work at AII Saints' Church. The drainage system has been cleaned out and protected from future blockage; painting of the inside of the tower and protection against birds has been completed; fall pipes and gutters have been painted and in places replaced; an old fence has been removed. It was agreed to proceed with repairs to the roof of AII Saints' Church.
- 5 A report was given on a recent visit by the Archdeacon to St Cuthbert's Church. The Diocesan Advisory Committee is to visit the church in March.
- 6 The fabric committee is to consider the heating problems at St Cuthbert's Church, and repairs to the tower at All Saints' Church. A list of priorities for maintenance of the fabric of both churches is to be drawn up. A stone cross has had to be removed from the porch at St Cuthbert's since it was in a dangerous condition. It is likely the cross will have to be replaced.
- 7 A report was given on Churches Together in Ackworth, and on the opening of the Traicraft Shop in Bell Lane.
- 8 A discussion took place on the House of Bishop's recent statement on episcopal and pastoral care of those opposed to the ordination of women to the priesthood, including the provision of alternative. oversight by visiting bishops. The Rector was asked to write to the bishop expressing the views of the PCC. The general view was one of unhappiness at the proposals, since it would be seen as divisive within the church.
- 9 Arrangements for the Annual Meeting were discussed, including a proposal that in future only a third of PCC members should retire in any one year.
