"Why Stand Ye Gazing"

Apart from Saints' days and the Feast of the Transfiguration in August - the Feast of the Ascension at the end of May and Pentecost in early June are the Church's last two major festivals until All Saints' Day in November.

This long period without any major celebrations, and the holiday season in the middle of it, seems to leave the Church at a low ebb. Following a very busy time in which we seem to get a rapid succession of festivals and holy days, i.e. Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent and Easter, the many months following Pentecost seems to be a time when we take a 'spiritual holiday'. Following the birth of the early Church however, this could not be said to be the case. It was (as it should be for us) a time of revival; for planning action and building for the future. All this motivated by the great spiritual 'explosion' and outpouring following the Ascension and Pentecost: two events closely associated with one another

This month I would like to reflect briefly upon the Ascension of our Lord. My two abiding memories of the Ascension still raise a smile whenever I call them to mind. The first is of a stained glass window in Lincoln where I regularly worshipped during my training for the ordained ministry. The window depicting the Ascension showed several

of the Apostles stood around on a hill looking up into a cloud, out of which a pair of feet dangled. The sight of those two feet protruding from a cloud was a constant source of amusement to my fellow students and myself.

The second memory is one which arises out of the account of the Ascension in the book of Acts (1:6-11). The scene is described when the eleven Apostles were gathered together looking on as Jesus is lifted up to heaven and then left gazing into the clouds at the point where he disappeared. Two angels appear and ask them the question "...men of Galilee, why stand ye gazing up into heaven?" The picture that this scene conjures up in my mind is that of several people standing around a building site in a busy thoroughfare gazing upwards as they see other doing. I find this to be another amusing reflection on human nature and this scene which describes the Ascension.

Amusing though these images of the Ascension may be, they do hold a serious message for us. The Apostles as they gazed at the spot in the clouds where their Lord had disappeared from view were probably reminiscing upon the glories of their recent past, spent with their master. The angels' comments I believe were intended to shock them out of the melancholic day dreaming.



Reading between the lines I think that what they probably meant to say was "Why stand ye gazing ... you have work to do – go out and get on this it!" Indeed, only a few days later, they were to be inspired and equipped to do the tasks entrusted to them; to begin building the church for the future.

That comment of the angels I think holds a message for us too. Instead of gazing back with fond memories of glorious past times in our Church, we should be planning, acting and building for a yet more glorious future. In other words, we shouldn't dwell on the past event of the Ascension as the end of an era, but look forward in terms of its unbreakable link with Pentecost as the beginning of a new era. The past has much to teach us, but it cannot be changed and the lessons learnt can be used for the future. To dwell on the past means that present opportunities pass us by, and if there is to be any

future for the church then we must begin to build toward that future now.

As I will have commented at the APCM – due to a good response to the stewardship campaign in 1999 and a freeze on the Diocesan quota for 2000, we are happily in the 'black' for once as regards our annual budget. BUT with a rise of some 7½% on our quota for this year alone and several years ahead of urgent expensive repairs to the fabric of our church we cannot afford to stand around waiting for the next crisis and urgent appeal. As the angels said to the apostles on that hill of the ascension I now say to you "Why stand ye gazing?"



There are a lot of bluebells coming up in odd places in my garden — reminders of when this area was wild, before it was fenced off in building lots.

A friend has built me some steps down into the dry stream-bed at the bottom of the garden — three solid, heavy slabs of concrete. The second slab down is now askew, pushed aside a good six inches by, incredibly, bluebell leaves.

It is amazing how such tender leaves can exert such strength, with such steady, inexorable persistence. I shall leave them to flower and move them in the autumn, when the leaves have died down and the bulbs have built up for the next season. They are only common bluebells but I feel they merit a special place, set-aside, where they can spread and give pleasure.

As I stand pondering about them I enjoy a surprising warmth from the pale spring sunshine. A skylark sings its heart out, high in the sky above the field beyond, but it is invisible, as invisible as the Holy Spirit singing within me. I feel His Spirit, His tender strength and steady

inexorable persistence flowering in me, along with the bluebells.

With a rush of gratitude I am aware that He has a special place for me, and for each one of us, a special place, set-aside, where we can grow, and He can radiate His love through us, even though we have done nothing ourselves to merit it.



Would you like your income to increase by 28%?!

Well, that would be great, but not very likely.

However, there is a way for the Church to increase its income by 28% and that is through 'Gift Aid'.

If you are a tax payer you can give a donation to your church and the church can claim back the tax you have paid on that amount.

Q. I usually just put my collection straight into the plate, can I 'Gift Aid'? A. Yes. As long as you have paid the equivalent amount of tax - 28p for every £1 you give. You will also need to fill in a very simple form and put it into an envelope with

your collection.

Q. I already make my contribution through a stewardship envelope.

A. Although you already make a regular commitment to the church you can still use 'Gift Aid' either by filling in a form each

time or on a more long term basis by filling in a simple form which is available from the covenant secretary – John Gardham.

Q. I already have a covenant for my giving to the church, can I use 'Gift Aid'?

A. The amount you give through a covenant will continue until the end of your four year period. After which your covenant will cease and 'Gift Aid' takes its place – you will be informed

about this at the right time. However, should you wish to increase your regular giving the increased amount can be given through 'Gift Aid'.

Q. I would like to make a one-off gift to the church. Is it possible to do this through 'Gift Aid'?

A. Yes! This is where 'Gift Aid' becomes much more flexible than covenanting ever was. You just need to fill in the form and hand it in together with your gift.

Q. Is it really that easy?

A. Yes. As long as you have paid the equivalent amount of tax. Even if you only pay a small amount of tax as long

as you have paid the equivalent amount you can use 'Gift Aid'.

Don't forget to keep a record of all that you give through 'Gift Aid', either to the church or any other registered charity, as the

inland revenue may ask for details.

As our churches are in the process of organising funding for repairs and renovations please bear in mind that any donations you wish to make to this can also be made through 'Gift Aid' just mark your form 'Repairs Fund'.

Forms are available at the back of church or from John Gardham. If you would like further help or information ask one of churchwardens, Bryan Lewis or any PCC member.
