

Just glancing through the lectionary in preparation for this article, I find, much to my surprise, that there are many celebrations and feast days to focus upon this month.

Not surprising in itself, but when considered in light of the fact that virtually the whole of the month is taken up by Lent, a season of solemn abstinence, then it prompted a slightly raised eyebrow. It makes me wonder whether a little medieval manipulation went on when fixing the dates of such celebrations to give a little light relief to the rigour.

To give a brief run-down; we have two prominent Saints days of particular note to residents of the British Isles: St David, the patron saint of Wales on the 1st and St Cuthbert, our own church's patron saint on the 20th. On Sundays we have Mothering Sunday on the 10th, Passion Sunday on the 17th and Palm Sunday on the 24th followed by the most significant week of the year; Holy Week. Last, but by no means least, the most important celebration of the year, Easter Sunday on the 31st As feasts were very much permitted in penitential season, it hardly seems like there's room to draw breath, let alone change out of sackcloth and ashes.

Although at first glance, it may seem a mixed bag of commemorations, on closer inspection they do in fact have a common thread, the lives of the two saints were distinguished by their charity and great love for the people they served. Cuthbert in particularly was devout in prayer, and teaching the gospels, expounding the love of Christ. As Bishop of Lindisfarne, he never lost his common touch' and was devoted to caring for his flock. His life and that of St David were notable for their love of God and their fellow men.

Mothering Sunday is day upon which we emphasise the devotion and love of mother hood and the selfless sacrifice mothers make for their children. And then we see the most supreme examples of sacrificial love in the remembrance of our Lord's love for us enshrined in the festival of Passion Sunday, Palm Sunday and Holy Week.

To crown all these, we see the triumph of love in the shape of Easter Sunday; the final victory, when love conquers even death itself. The common thread which runs right the way through this month of penitence and celebration, you will probably have realised by now, is LOVE. Not the soppy sentimental thing we misleadingly label love -



which is gushing out of every commercial outlet as I write this article on Valentines Day - but that deep sacrificial love given by example to us by our Lord's love for us; so committed that he even faced extreme pain (passion) and death on the cross.

One of the best expressions of that quality of love I could find is described in the final verse of that well know Victorian hymn written by Cecil Spring Rice – 'I Vow to Thee my Country'

I vow to thee my country, all earthly things above, entire and whole and perfect, the service of my love; the love that asks no question, the love that stands the test, that lays upon the altar the dearest and the best; the love that never falters, the love that makes undaunted

the final sacrifice.'

Last month I wrote of the need for self-

examination. reflection and renewal: a re-focusing on the centre of our Christian lives - God! This month we see in the festivals we celebrate that supreme expression of God ... LOVE. Our Lenten preparation could be seen as the preparing of our hearts and lives, a place where love may dwell; 'a love that makes undaunted, the final sacrifice'

- · Coffee mornings at All Saints' are proving successful.



Urgent Repairs Must Start Soon!

Each day that passes before we can start the urgent repairs to the St Cuthbert's church roof will allow the stonework to deteriorate even further. The roof is leaking where it is supported by the walls and the valley guttering between the vestry and the chancel must be replaced as there are holes in the lead lining the gutter.

As stated in last month's magazine we have thankfully raised almost half of the money needed to start the first phase of the work some £9,500 of the £22,000 needed but we must raise the balance quickly so that this critical part of the work can be put in hand.

The Appeal launched in November for approximately £335,000 will have


entered a new phase by the time you read this magazine. By early March our appeal brochure will have been sent to everyone who is either on the current church electoral roll, have used the church for baptisms, weddings or funerals or regularly help us with our general expenditure by direct giving, to local businesses and to many others besides.

Our Church of England Infant and Junior School, the Ackworth Howard School, has a shortage of Study Bibles for use in R.E. lessons. As there is a lack of funds for




