Dear Friends

As the long lazy days of Summer become a distant memory and frenetic rush to get the harvest in against the limitations of shorter daylight hours and worsening weather, we reach the point when Autumn can be truly said to have arrived. As the evenings becoming dark after our evening meal, we seem to be more limited to indoor and to some extent sedentary pursuits. The middle of this period (Oct/Nov) sharpens our focus on more spiritual than physical activities. In particular the 1st and 2nd November with the festivals of All Saints and All Souls and leading up to the 8th & 11th with its focus on Remembrance draws our attentions to those great spiritual imponderables of life and death.

Whilst the pursuit of the meaning of life is often abandoned due to the complexity of its questioning death can leave us in shock by its sudden finality. Does anything lie beyond that moment of death, the answer is that we simply don't know - nobody (as the old saying goes) has ever come back to tell us! Although, that is not quite true for Christians with our belief of the resurrection! For many however, this hope is a non-starter. Death for many people is an event which separates us from others an ending of physical contact with our loved ones.

All Saints and All Souls, when we acclaim the saints and honour the dead is an opportunity to revisit the lesson that Jesus left us in the resurrection that death is not simply an ending but also the possibility of a new beginning or a continuation albeit in a different way. These festivals remind us Jesus' death and resurrection changes the despair of non-believers - it takes away the finality of death with the realisation that our lives do continue to bear fruit in the lives of others - those who we have to have a close connection with us. By dying Jesus' life was reborn in the lives of millions of others. His life inspired the words and actions of countless other lives who dedicated all that they were to him - the Saints we acclaim on the 1st November.

Although I am in contact with many who have lost loved ones, and feel their pain, I was touched personally this summer by the death of a close friend and family member. It was in writing a eulogy and pondering in the first instance the loss of what they had meant to me, that I realised the way in which they had changed me and become a part of who I now am was not loss but gain. They were in a very real way re-born in me continuing the life I now live and share with others. This was how Jesus changed the lives of million, if not billions of Christians.

This new hope - the reality of new life; life re-born was explained far better than I ever could in a book I was reading at the time 'Eternal

Seasons' by Michael Ford. I would like to leave you with a quote from that book, in the chapter 'Recollection. Season of Remembrance' "Jesus died so that our own death need no longer be merely separation. The death of Christ opened for us the possibility of making our own death a way to union and re-integration ... Our lives will continue to bear fruit after we have died"

May I wish you the consolation and hope in realising the fruit you bear from all those who have gone before you and now dwell in the heavenly kingdom with All the Saints for ever - Amen.

Visit to Holy Island

On 25th July twenty eight members of St. Cuthbert's, All Saint's and Ackworth Churches Together set off for the long journey to Northumberland to visit Lindisfarne. Planned to start at 08.00 the coach arrived on time and we were on our way by 08.02 in a 56 seater allowing two seats each if required. Mary bagged a back seat relating that, as an ex bus conductress she had no fear of travel sickness.

An uneventful journey north until we reached the Yorkshire/Durham border when the coach stopped for a comfort break, there seemed a reluctance to get off but, once someone had moved, there was a mad dash. We were lucky around Sunderland, where an Air Show was advertised, that there were no traffic hold ups. The island was visible in the distance long before we reached it and the journey across the causeway breath taking; we learned that it was one of the lowest tides of

the year. We arrived at 12.00 when the party was joined by three others, who were holidaying nearby, plus three dogs.

The party then split up with eight joining Jackie & Paul for a well-trodden favourite five mile walk around the island, it was advertised as five but seemed a lot further, over sand hills/dunes, beaches, difficult rocky shores and field paths. It was well worth the effort the weather was perfect, with beautiful scenery in a panoramic setting, the dogs enjoyed themselves putting us all to shame with their unbridled energy, one of the party even had a paddle. In the distance we could see the Farne Islands, the lighthouse, of Grace Darling fame fully visible. We were told that it is undergoing renovation (solar power?) Nearer at hand we saw four seals basking on the rocks. We picnicked on an almost deserted beach, but only a short distance from the busy car parks.

The remainder of the party occupied themselves visiting the Castle, Priory, the Visitors Centre and Winery and various hostelrys, some picnicked whilst trying to solve the clues set in a Pilgrimage Quiz, local knowledge and reference to guide books was useful, did you know that one car a day gets stuck on the causeway? We noted a stall selling locally grown fruit and vegetables but there was little sign of any agriculture, although fishermen's activity was very visible.

Although there were crowds of other visitors, of all nationalities, there was an air of calm and peace in this wonderful place.

We all gathered together at St. Mary's the Parish Church at 16.00 where Paul led us in Evening Worship, beforehand we were treated to two lovely pieces of ethereal music, 'Pilgrimage' and 'I heard the voice if Jesus', played by Bob Davies on a Low Whistle, Julie played the organ for two hymns, 'As the deer pants for the water' and 'Be though my vision, O Lord of my heart'

We left at 17.00 for our long journey home, as forecast the rain started shortly afterwards, taking a different route to the outward one, there were plenty of road works but no delays, giving us a sight of The Angel of the North and Washington Services, which we passed through without stopping, although we did stop later! North of Scotch Corner the driver stopped the coach suddenly, to our concern, but it emerged that he had advanced notice that the road ahead was blocked. After consulting SatNav and telephone Apps we diverted through country lanes to find an alternative route, it was somewhat confusing that we ignored one sign posted route to Croft then took the next one! We re-joined the A1 north of Wetherby and reached home at 21.15 after a thoroughly enjoyable day. We have only been to Northumberland once before, we ask ourselves why?

The quiz was won by Andrew Ward who generously shared the prize

chocolate orange around the coach.

The party expressed their gratitude to Paul for arranging this most memorable day. Mention should also be made of the impressive behaviour of the Branston twins on this very long and tiring day out.

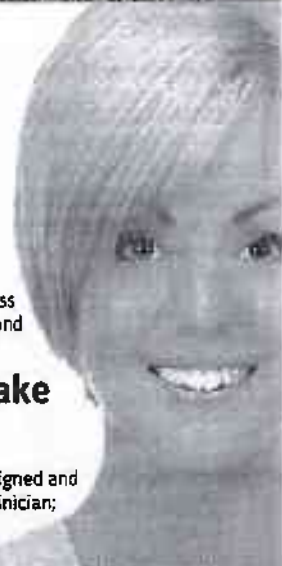
