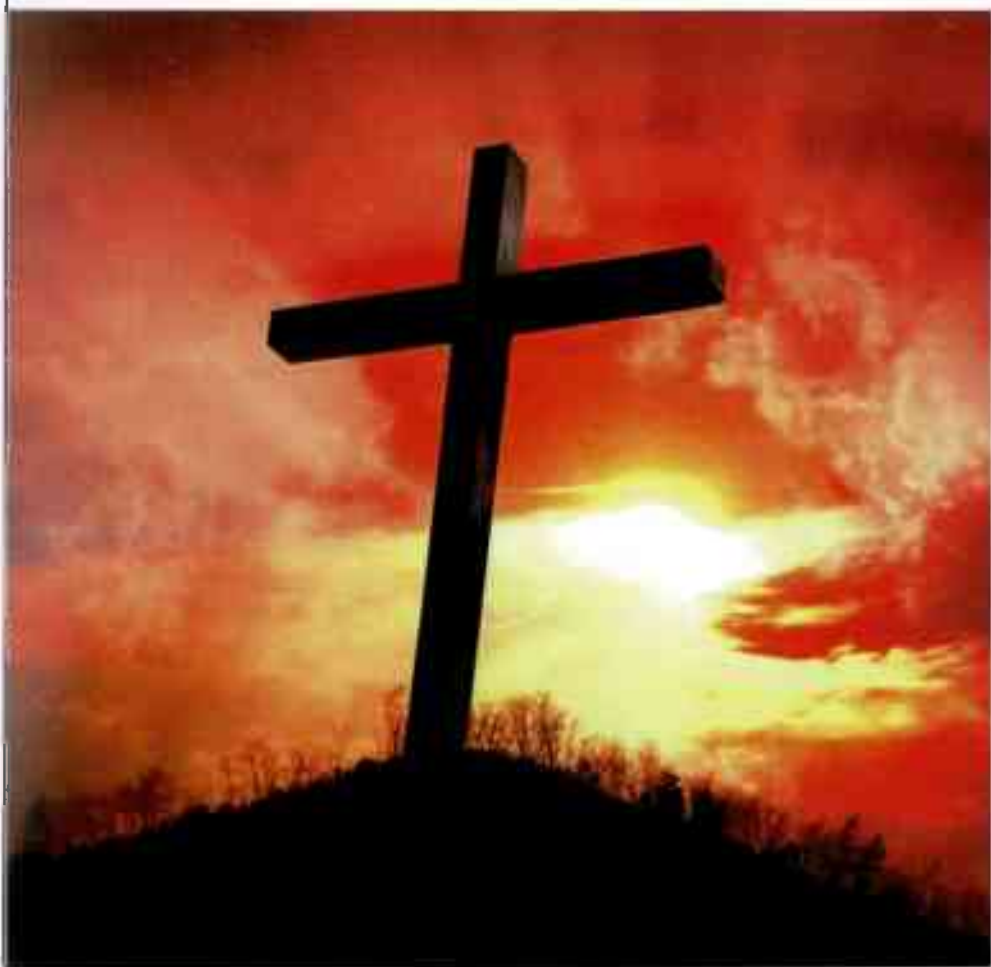

Prayer is nothing but pure attention...

To pray is to open our whole selves to God. Each one of us is made by God to reflect the very nature of God. Sometimes all we need to do in prayer is to be still and place ourselves in God's presence. Prayers that are said in the silence of our minds flow with instinct and emotion full of our longings, rising up from our hearts, and flowing out from our bodies. In prayer we are not to deny our realities, but recognise their claim on our lives, letting prayer be the speech that extends beyond ourselves to God. God's loving influence within our prayer is the influence of truth, so in this way prayer is a journey towards living closer to the truth. God himself is the way, the truth and the life, this journey extends outwards responding to the God which seeks us.

Difficulties in prayer...

For many people trying to pray every day isn't easy, wandering thoughts and distractions can be a real difficulty. For others many things get in the way, we don't always have the time, things crop up, we may not be in the mood or we forget. We might not even think we need to pray every day.

Be assured that many people struggle with prayer. Jesus, however, knew that prayer is the absolute foundation of our Christian living and we must persevere. When we pray we are never alone; when saying the Lord's Prayer, people are saying those same words alongside us all over the world. They are supporting us, and we are supporting them. Only together in this way are we the one true body of Christ.

Daily discipline of prayer...

The practice of daily prayers grew from the Jewish practice of reciting prayers at set times of the day. This practice is believed to have been passed down through the centuries from the Apostles, with different practices developing in different places.

Having a regular pattern of daily prayer requires perseverance and constancy. This great tradition of regular prayer within our churches is called the 'daily office'. In its basic form the daily office consists of psalms and prayers and can take a variety of forms. The clergy have an obligation to pray the morning and evening office as it is set out in Cannon Law every day, wherever possible praying with and alongside the people in the parish.

Daily prayer in the parish...

I would like to encourage anyone who wants to start the discipline of daily

prayer with the church. There are a number of ways to create such a discipline. Firstly attending the daily office alongside the clergy, we would greatly appreciate your company and support as we join our prayers together (the times of the parish daily office are below).

It is important as clergy to be the prayerful presence in our churches, we pray in each church in turn, uniting our daily prayers with those prayers that have gone before and those to come.

Our church buildings are saturated in the prayers of our communities, sitting in this prayerful space daily offering our prayers to God is foundational to parish life, therefore creating a community with us as we pray together is vital.

Secondly committing yourselves to pray daily wherever you may be, praying at an agreed time, so that even if we are physically alone, we are praying alongside each other. A simple version of the daily office has been printed and is now in both churches completely free. This resource follows a simple version of the daily office for you to use whether at home, work or away, it only takes a few minutes to complete.

Sometimes there is the real difficulty when following a set order of prayer, there is always the danger that we feel the need to get through it, times of silence and attentiveness in prayer are as important as the words. Therefore joining together in prayer and uniting as the body of Christ we are supported and encouraged to persevere.

The prayer challenge...

Let us please join together in the daily office of our Parish and wider church, a church that prays together in the way, the truth, and the life of God, is a church that will thrive and draw others to it. Happy praying!

Persian language Holy Communion has national launch at Wakefield Cathedral

Wakefield Cathedral has hosted a special service to launch the Church of England's first Persian language translation of Holy Communion to further engage with the growing numbers of Iranians in our congregations. Some 500 Iranians from across the country packed into the cathedral, one of three in the Diocese of Leeds, and were welcomed by Dean Simon Cowling and Subdean Tony Macpherson.

Authorised by the House of Bishops, the publication of the Farsi language service affirms the presence of Iranians in churches as a gift, and demonstrates commitment to welcoming them into the life of the Church of England. The new liturgy is designed to be used alongside English language liturgy, with both languages printed side by side, enabling people to follow and participate

in services.

At a special celebration service in Wakefield Cathedral, the Bishop of Bradford Toby Howarth and the Bishops of Loughborough and Durham used the wording for the first time. Members of congregations from churches across England, including British, Iranian and other

nationality Christians, attended the event which included the singing of hymn verses in English and Farsi alternately and prayers in both languages.

The Bishop of Loughborough, the Rt Revd Guli Francis-Dehqani, who came to the UK from Iran with her family when she was just 14-years-old, presided at the celebration and conveyed messages from the Archbishops of Canterbury and York.

Bishop Toby spoke of the Iranians coming to our churches as something God is doing across our churches and across the world: "We are not just the Church of England, we are the church of God and we want people to be able to worship in their own language alongside each other."



Persistence

Picture the scene. My wife and I are stood in the car park of Nostell Priory. It is 8:30 in the morning. My face is red, and I am quite breathless. I reach in to the car, to retrieve a bottle of an isotonic drink. My wife reaches in to the car and retrieves a medal, which she places around my neck, and then applauds me. What was happening? I had just completed the running programme called Couch to 5K.

If you know me well, you know that I am not a runner. I haven't run since I was at school, and then I was always in the last three of a class of fifty. So for me, this was a huge achievement, and in my wife's eyes, worthy of a medal. I thought it was worthy of a stiff drink.

For the previous three months, we had been running three times a week, increasing the time we run each time. During that time, I had sprained my ankle, twisted my knee, had two colds, and a lingering cough. However, after eleven weeks, I completed the nine week programme!!

St Paul in his letter to the Philippians writes something similar when he compares the Christian journey of life, to a race. In the letter to the Hebrews, this kind of Christian journey is described as taking place in an area, surrounded by a great cloud of witnesses, which are all the saints in heaven, all cheering us on as we run the race, this journey.

Christian or not, we are all travelling through life, we are all on a journey, we are all running a race. The Bible is scattered with great characters, and the story of their lives. The things they encountered, the problems, the celebrations. And the greatest of these is the story we hear about the life of Jesus.

As I write, we are moving swiftly through Lent, a time when we remember difficulties, to the great celebration of Easter, when we remember Jesus' triumph over death.

Running, racing, travelling, life, they all have their difficulties, and we can easily succumb to those difficulties. But if we persevere, if we, in St Paul's words, strive for the goal, we too can get to a point of celebration. A point where we too can wear a medal, which St Paul describes as a crown. A crown which Jesus has won for us, and desires so much to give to us.

Wherever you are on your journey, remember that we are all on this journey, at different points. We can encourage each other along the way, we can persevere, we can take heart from the stories of those Bible characters, we can listen to the great cloud of witness, as they cheer us on. And at the end, we can receive a pat on the back, and the Crown of Victory.

Fresh hope for all at Easter

At a time when tragic street violence as well as fears over Brexit have dominated much of the news agenda, it is important to find signs of hope for our apparently fragmenting society.

At Wakefield Cathedral, I was privileged to witness that wonderful public space packed with worshippers from Iran, the UK and other backgrounds. We were celebrating the translation of the Holy Communion service into Farsi. Many who came had made costly decisions to follow Christ, sometimes losing businesses and family, and enduring horrendous journeys to escape persecution. Those I met were delighted, committed and intensely serious about their faith in Jesus.

Bishop Guli from Loughbrough, for example, who presided at the Eucharist, has told how her own brother Bahram was murdered just a month before her family fled to safety in England in 1980. For many, it has been Christians and churches who have offered care and love along their journeys to freedom.



At Wakefield, I was struck by the amazing new communion of people now sharing their different pasts and places under our roof, brought together by Jesus Christ. Mohsen, a surveyor from Iran, when asked why he and wife Sara, practising Christians in Iran, had chosen to join the Church of England, replied: "Because it is the Church of England, England's church and England welcomed me and my family."

When immigrants to the USA gain the right to stay, no one questions their swift and grateful loyalty to the Stars and Stripes. And similarly, I believe we can take real hope from the Persian and other families who are committing to worship in our churches; they too are committed to bringing their skills and energy, playing a full part in our communities.

These people are real gifts to our churches and parishes, and remind us how at Easter, God brings new life and reconciliation from the most surprising situations.

Face up to farming issues

RIPON Bring Parliament to the Dales to learn the tough realities of Northern farming, says Bishop Helen-Ann Hartley, who speaks for the Diocese on rural issues. In the full version of an opinion piece published in the Yorkshire Post, the Bishop of Ripon writes:

“My father once told me a story of going into a field after it had been ploughed and looking at the furrows, and seeing them as if the earth were improvising with itself through the work of the farmer: the rows of tilled soil, and the back and forth pattern which is similar, but not repetitive. Farming works with the seasons and rhythms of the year.”

New service for deaf Christians

HUDDERSFIELD Deaf Christians and hearing friends have launched a new service led entirely in British Sign Language, but translated and voiced into English for hearing people.



There was a good turnout at the first event held at Christ Church, Pellon, Halifax, which will now be repeated on the second Sunday evening of every month.

Vicar, Revd John Hellewell said: “The first service was fantastic! There was a great sense of togetherness and fun, and we can’t wait till the next one.

“It’s been a real joy having deaf members as an important part of our congregation.

“It’s great that they are now taking a lead in designing a regular service that meets their needs whilst building links with the hearing members.”

Speaking afterwards, Jonathan said: "I'm looking forward to meeting and working with people in this wonderful area.

"My wife and I have lived here twice before, and when this opportunity arose I had to answer a calling."

Bishop Paul said how the "glorious Archdeaconry of Richmond and Craven" was looking forward to Jonathan bringing a new stability and urged everyone to cherish him and Flora as they progress both its identity and that of the Diocese of Leeds.

Jonathan's interests include the countryside, history, ecumenism, classical and baroque music and fly fishing.

Fact-finding trip to Hanover
