The Ackworth Annual Pilgrimage – Summer 2019

This is now the fifth year that Ackworth Christians have undertaken a walking pilgrimage – and it took place on Saturday July 13th. This year we were again heading up into North Yorkshire, to the coast, to walk from Scarborough along part of the coastal path called The Cleveland Way to a special church in Filey.

There were 30 of us (and 2 dogs!), including Nigel the driver, heading off to the A1 North junction just after 9.00am that morning. Unfortunately, because of illness or incapacity, some eager Pilgrims had to drop out but the rest of us promised to report back at the end of the day. The weather looked promising – for which we were all thankful, given the heavy rain that we had had for most of that week – and there was a quiet air of excitement as we travelled through lovely countryside to start our walk. Some Pilgrims had decided to wander around the town rather than along the coastal path so having left 18 (and 2 dogs) to trek along the cliff-tops the rest went with Nigel into the popular and attractive town of Filey.

The weather was perfect for the walk, bright and yet fresh. We chatted, shared stories and stopped to admire the superb views of the sea along the way and before we knew it we had walked the 3 miles to the large grassy patch which was ideal for our lunch break. What a view! What a place this is! But we had 3 ½ more miles to go and knew we had to get moving again, this time once again on the top of the cliffs and walking with the sparkling sea stretching out on one side and fields on the other, passing through holiday home camp sites and greeting many other walkers along the way.

Finally, just around the bend in the landscape we saw the lovely town of Filey – and we all searched the skyline of buildings to see who would be the first to spot the church. It was getting quite hot by this time and Pilgrims were discussing what to do when we arrived in the town; some were keen to look at the shops, others to catch up with friends and family who they hoped would be waiting for them and some, me included, were really hoping for an ice-cream and to sit for a while watching the holiday makers and day-trippers enjoying the lovely activities and views from the clifftops. It is a long time since I had enjoyed an ice cream so much! We had planned to meet up with the rest of the Pilgrims and find out what they had been doing in the town all day – and as we arrived at the church on the outskirts of Filey, the others arrived! By this time, we were all feeling very hot and eager to go inside the church, to cool down but also it looked very interesting.

We were greeted by a very welcoming Church Warden and invited inside the church. It is a 12th Century church, with a large gold coloured fish on top of the flagpole and the most beautiful and well cared for graveyard. Oh, did I mention it, it is St Oswald's Church, overlooking the Brigg?

The highlight of the day was yet to come – our service of thanksgiving, with hymns and prayer was inspiring (and thanks Bob for adding the accompaniment on the Irish whistle). To join with friends in such a lovely place felt very special that afternoon.

This was another brilliant Pilgrimage where we could join in friendship and faith, value our heritage and our countryside and appreciate the tremendous efforts those early Christians made to spread their beliefs. Of course, we are all left with a big question... "where are we going next time?" I am sure Rev Paul Fox will have a plan!

Wherever we go, whatever happens in 2020, be assured Oliver – your name will be at the top of the list!

Pilgrimage to Walsingham Monday 26th August 2019

Bank Holiday Monday started early for our pilgrimage to Walsingham, a picturesque village in North Norfolk, famous for its religious shrines in honour of the Virgin Mary. We happy band of pilgrims set off from Ackworth at 7:30am bright and early! We were greeted by the Rev Charlene who set the scene for us as we said a prayer together before setting off. We arrived at Walsingham in time to have a look round and find our way through the delightful village to reach the Anglican Shrine of Our Lady, the main focus of our day.
